Cost: £30, to include refreshments and lunch

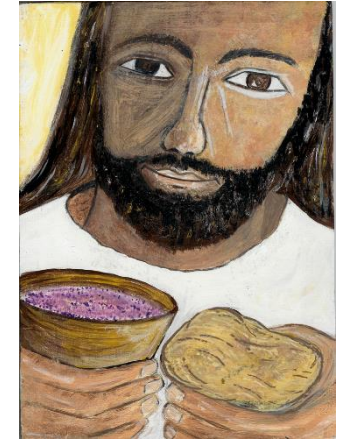

Greeting – Word and Wondering –
Response – Feast – Dismissal.
And so it is a particularly appropriate way to explore the Eucharist.

In our time together we shall share several Godly Play core stories. The day will take place in a worshipful context and there will be the opportunity to wonder together and share a response time.
